SGA COMMITTEES

Academic Affairs Committee

The Academic Affairs Committee will address issues concerning the teaching, research, and service functions of Missouri State University by providing educational and service programs—undergraduate, graduate, outreach, credit and non-credit—to meet the needs and interests of our students and citizens.

Projects- creating a syllabi database, revamp course evaluations, creating a clear academic process, expand outreach to undeclared majors

Administrative Services Committee

The Administrative Services Committee will address issues that deal with constructing and maintaining a safe, secure, well-maintained, competently-staffed, efficient, functional environment conducive to, and for the purpose of, developing educated persons.

Projects- University carpool program, parking, Bearline projects, construction and campus expansion

Information Services Committee

The Information Services Committee will address issues that deal with constructing and maintaining a safe, secure, well-maintained, competently-staffed, efficient, functional environment conducive to, and for the purpose of, developing educated persons.

Projects- merging access card to Bear pass, updating the MSU mobile app, and increasing student security

Public Affairs Committee

The Public Affairs Committee will address issues promoting the general welfare of students at the university, community, state, and federal levels as well as promote all political affairs related to the welfare of higher education

Projects- Public Affairs on campus and in the community, boomer meals for the homeless, safe ride program, and voting

Diversity and Inclusion Committee

The Diversity and Inclusion Committee will work to promote equity and diversity within the university community as well as the local community. The committee will be charged with advancing the understanding of equity and diversity and researching the needs and concerns of students.

Projects— looking into the Climate Study results, Diversity Center Building, and campus unity through student leaders, programs and projects

Internal Affairs Committee

The Internal Affairs committee will address issues concerning the internal functioning of the Senate, including executive appointments, removal of senators, and new organization petitions and constitutions.

Projects—Student Organization Constitutions, SGA Constitution and Bylaw revisions

Research and Development Committee

The Research and Development Committee will focus on the advancement, implementation, and maintenance of university-wide technology.

Projects- helping aid other Directors with project research, grip tape in campus buildings, student opinion research

Student Affairs Committee

The Student Affairs Engagement Committee will focus on the advancement of student's resources, enjoyment and engagement of the student body. This will include programs and services that students can access to promote a healthy, educational lifestyle.
